


This won the 2015 Pulitzer Prize for Drama. Mr. Guirgis has been in the field for about 20 years, and he's written a number of outstanding plays including "Our Lady of 121st Street" and "The Last Days of Judas Iscariot" (my favorite by him). Mr. Guirgis's plays are usually set in NYC and involve a number of down-on-their-luck characters. Some struggle with substance abuse and scattered dedication to 12-step programs; many have been wounded in romance and most are looking for a better life (though they don't see how redemption can happen).

This story is centered around Walter "Pops" Washington, a black NY police officer who was forced to retire early after a white rookie cop shot him 6 times by accident. He lives in a rent controlled house on Riverside Drive with his son, his son's girlfriend and his son's recently paroled friend. It has echoes of August Wilson and Arthur Miller in regards to the role of work in shaping identity and how our work & relationships impact our offspring.
